## GUIDELINES FOR ASSISTING HEAD START PARENTS WITH COUNSELING

- 1. A Head Start parent / guardian has indicated, either by personal interview or during a Family Partnership meeting, that counseling is needed.
- 2. The Family Services Coordinator will determine what kind of counseling is being requested personal, marital, family, etc. If the counseling requested is specifically for the Head Start child, then a referral should be made to the Education Manager.
- 3. The Family Services Coordinator will discuss with the parent:
  - What is the problem or concern?
  - Is this a new or recurring (chronic) concern?
  - Has counseling been received in the past? When? Where?
- 4. What counseling services are available in their local community?
  - Community Mental Health Center/satellite sites or BIA Services
  - Through the family's church
  - Lutheran or Catholic Family Services
  - Private counseling offices
  - Public school counselors
- 5. Determine whether the family and/or specific child(ren) are receiving Medicaid/ CHIP. If not, are they eligible and do they need assistance applying for Medicaid?
- 6. If the family <u>is</u> receiving Medicaid, the Family Services Coordinator will assist the family in setting up an initial appointment.
  - A family receiving Medicaid needs to contact their Primary Doctor first. Their Primary Doctor must authorize mental health services by filling out a referral card for the parent to take to the mental health provider. Remind the parent to always take their Medicaid identification card with them to all appointments.
  - The FSC will assist the family with addresses, phone numbers and services available in their area. The family may need help in arranging transportation or child care.
  - 7. If the family is <u>not</u> Medicaid eligible and the family does not have private insurance coverage, then Head Start will assist the family in locating an Agency that will assist the family with payment.

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- 8. The NESD Head Start Program, Inc. may also provide assistance to the family to locate AA (Alcoholics Anonymous) meetings and / or other support groups that may be needed by the family.
- 9. As a last resort, with approval from the Director, Head Start funds may be used to pay for the <u>initial immediate</u> mental health counseling.
